CHILDREN AND NATURE

On average, today's kids spend up to 44 hours per week in front of a screen, and less than 10 minutes a day playing indoors, which researchers believe becomes extreme crisis, they called Nature Deficit Disorder (childrenandnature.org). Technology and parent's fears of diseases and dangers playing outside contributed to the crisis. However, recent studies have exposed the benefit-even necessity-of spending time outdoors, both for kids and adults. Most of the studies agree that kids who play outside are smarter, happier, more attentive and less anxious than kids who spend more time indoors. Nature provides countless opportunities for discovery, creativity, problemsolving and STEAM education. Interacting with natural environments allows children to learn by doing and experimenting with ideas. In nature, children think, question and make hypotheses-thereby developing inquisitive minds.

The slew of benefits that the outdoors provides to children's minds is ample reason to give it a try. Taking children outdoor as young as infant is the start. Happily there are lots of ways to make nature as stimulating activities that kids like to do inside.

1. Set up games such as treasure hunts or board games outside

- 2. Get a picture book to identify birds, bugs, leaves, trees, plants,
- flowers, etc.
- 3. Introduce tools to discover such as magnifying glass, bug box, shovel, etc.
- 4. Go to an outdoor event such as park visits, outdoor puppet show, outdoor plays and movies.
- 5. Use the technology to your advantage such as using phone cameras to take picture to create photo journals.

6. Take them to fruit/veggie picking, short nature walk or hiking, etc.

- Use items from outdoors such as leaves, sticks, rocks, etc. to create art or to build something. (Ref: Ideas for Getting Your Kids into Nature - Child Mind Institute) 7.
