## April is Month of the Military Child

Established by former U.S. Secretary of Defense Mr. Weinberger in 1986, the designation of April as the Month of the Military Child acknowledges the significant role military youth play in our communities. Why purple? Purple is the color that symbolizes all branches of the military, as it is a combination of Army green, Marine red, & the blue of the Coast Guard, Air Force and Navy.

As of Feb. 2022, Defense Manpower Data Center (DMDC) reports there are approximately about a million ages 0-18 years old children of active military families. VA has the largest number of 105,948 military children, followed by Texas and California while Maryland is the 7th in the nation with 29,006 kids from active duty.
